## **The Background of the organization**

The Rural Health Mission Nigeria (RHEMN) is a health volunteer and a Non-governmental Organization. It was founded on 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2014 by Muhammad Ahmad Saddiq who initiated the idea and the co-founder Muhammad Adamu Sule who was very passionate about community service. The organization commenced skeletal operation in June 2015 where it carried out her first free medical outreach in Gembu community in Sardauna LGA

(Mambilla Plateau), Taraba State. RHEMN was legally registered on 17<sup>th</sup> – 03-2017. This NGO focuses on the provision of basic healthcare services in rural and under-served communities. Our intervention include: Maternal and child care services, emergency health services, health advocacy/awareness campaigns, action against malaria and malnutrition, sustainable school health services and other social services.

**The Vision:**

Our vision is to see every community in Nigeria with uninterrupted access to basic healthcare services and enjoy essential social needs and RHEMN leading the way to universal health coverage.

**The Mission Statement:**

Our mission is to provide basic healthcare services to those living in rural or hard-to-reach communities including underserved areas. Our mission also covers social needs and humanitarian services during and after crisis or community conflicts.

**Goal:**

Our goal is to strengthen rural healthcare and improve access to basic healthcare services and essential social needs in underserved communities across Nigeria.

**Aims and objectives of the Organization:**

RHEMN is working towards achieving the following objectives for the benefit of those living in rural, hard-to-reach and underserved communities.

- To provide access to basic healthcare service in rural, hard-to-reach and underserved communities to facilitate maximum healthcare coverage
- To provide sustainable school health services in Nursery and primary schools to promote the safety, well-being, and healthy development of children and support young people's successful transition to adulthood;
- Ensure cost effective community-based affordable and easy access to sterile supplies especially during and after child birth
- Ensure regular access to ante and post natal supplement for pregnant women
- Promote economic and social well-being for individuals, families, and communities, including those with disabilities

- To train up required number of volunteers on Family Health Care, Traditional Birth attendants and health education programs etc.
- To print or publish periodical magazines, books, pamphlets, leaflets or booklets that the RHEMN may considered desirable or helpful in the promotion of its objects.
- To co-operate and partner with the governmental Organizations and agencies seeking the goal of redressing mortality rate and improving health status of common people or relief and rehabilitation at the time of any disaster.
- To plan and execute Development, Relief and Rehabilitation programs within the terms of objects of the RHEMN.
- Provide comprehensive response to healthcare threads in rural areas whether natural or man-made
- Support wellness efforts across the life span, from protecting mental healthcare, to preventing risky behaviors such as tobacco use and substance abuse, to promote better nutrition and physical activity
- To seek and receive subscriptions, donations and other supports from persons, institutions or Organizations both from home and abroad and use the same for the purposes of the Organization.
