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# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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Rural Health Mission Nigeria was solely established to support access to quality healthcare in under-served and hard-to-reach communities. We conduct medical outreaches to address short term medical needs, we support local clinics with essential drugs and other medical consumables as well as training health workers on basic lifesaving skills to build their capacity thereby strengthening the quality of services rendered. We also fight epidemics and create awareness about important public health diseases to promote public health.

The year was a challenging one but I am excited that we were able to achieve a lot within the year.

We organized campaign against the spread of malaria, we launched the volunteer health Corp (VHC) project, relaunched the facility support project, conducted medical outreaches, organized 2 other public health campaigns and introduced the weekly fitness walk and health screening. This year we reached about 2000 beneficiaries (men and women) through our medical outreaches, 2000+ pregnant women and over 40,000 under 5 year children. We provided over 2300 hours of volunteerism, trained about 300 health workers and supported 12 primary health facilities with essential drugs.

We participated in the community client satisfaction survey of the world bank project in Gombe state where we administered about 120 questionnaires. We extended partnership to INEX Cleaners LTD, Vitamin Angels, Global Giving and APIN Public health initiative. I Participated in the prestigious Mandela Washington Fellowship for young African leaders in the United State of America. I am looking forward to a sustainable year ahead.

# Major Projects



## MEDICAL OUTREACH

"Addressing short term medical needs"

We conducted 2 medical outreaches in Hina and Kagarawal Communities in Gombe state reaching about 1550 beneficiaries. The services provided includes; General health screening such as BP check, Diabetes, Hepatitis and eye screening.

## LIFESAVING INTERVENTION

"Addressing maternal and child mortality"

We supported more than 2000 pregnant women across 25 communities with over 100,000 doses of antenatal drugs and 1200 doses of antimalarials. We also supported over 40,000 under 5 children with single dose vitamin A supplements and deworming tablets.

## VOLUNTEER HEALTH CORPS

"Addressing manpower needs and strengthening local health facilities"

We launched the volunteer health corps project where health workers volunteer 3-4 hours per week. About 50 volunteers participated in 4 clinics in Gombe with cumulative 1600 volunteer hours in 6 months (July, 2018 - Dec 2018).

# Campaigns



## MALARIA DAY

We distributed 150 pieces of insecticide treated nets in Kagarawal, London maidoruwa, Gabukka and Bolari communities and screened 120 people for malaria and supported PHC Bolari, Gabukka, Kagarawal and London maidoruwa with 300 doses of free antimalarial drugs 300 RDT kits for malaria diagnosis.

## MATERNAL & CHILD HEALTH WEEK

We supported 12 PHC facilities with 12000 doses of antiworms, and 12,000 doses of Vitamin A Supplements to conduct medical outreaches marking the maternal and child health week 2018.

## ENVIR. HEALTH DAY

We mobilized 35 volunteers and carried out sanitation at Bauchi Park Gombe. We also engaged 22 food vendors and taught them basic hand washing techniques.

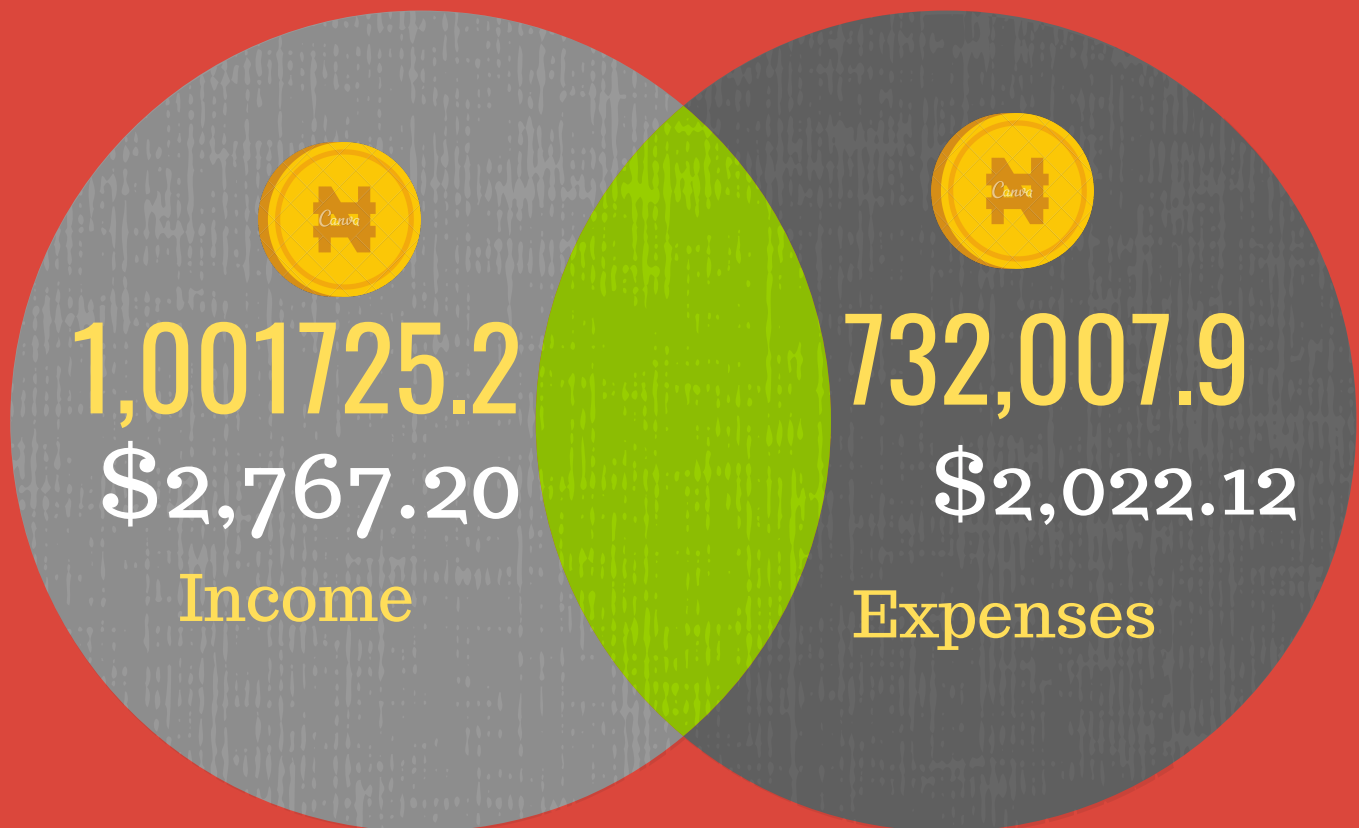

# Finances

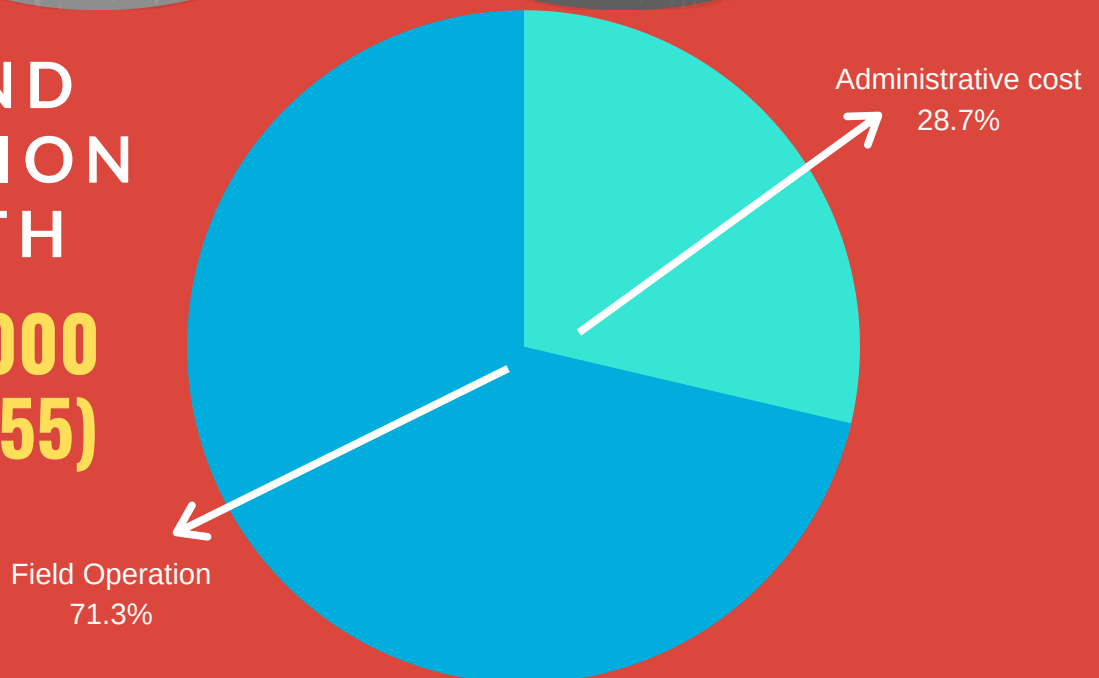
