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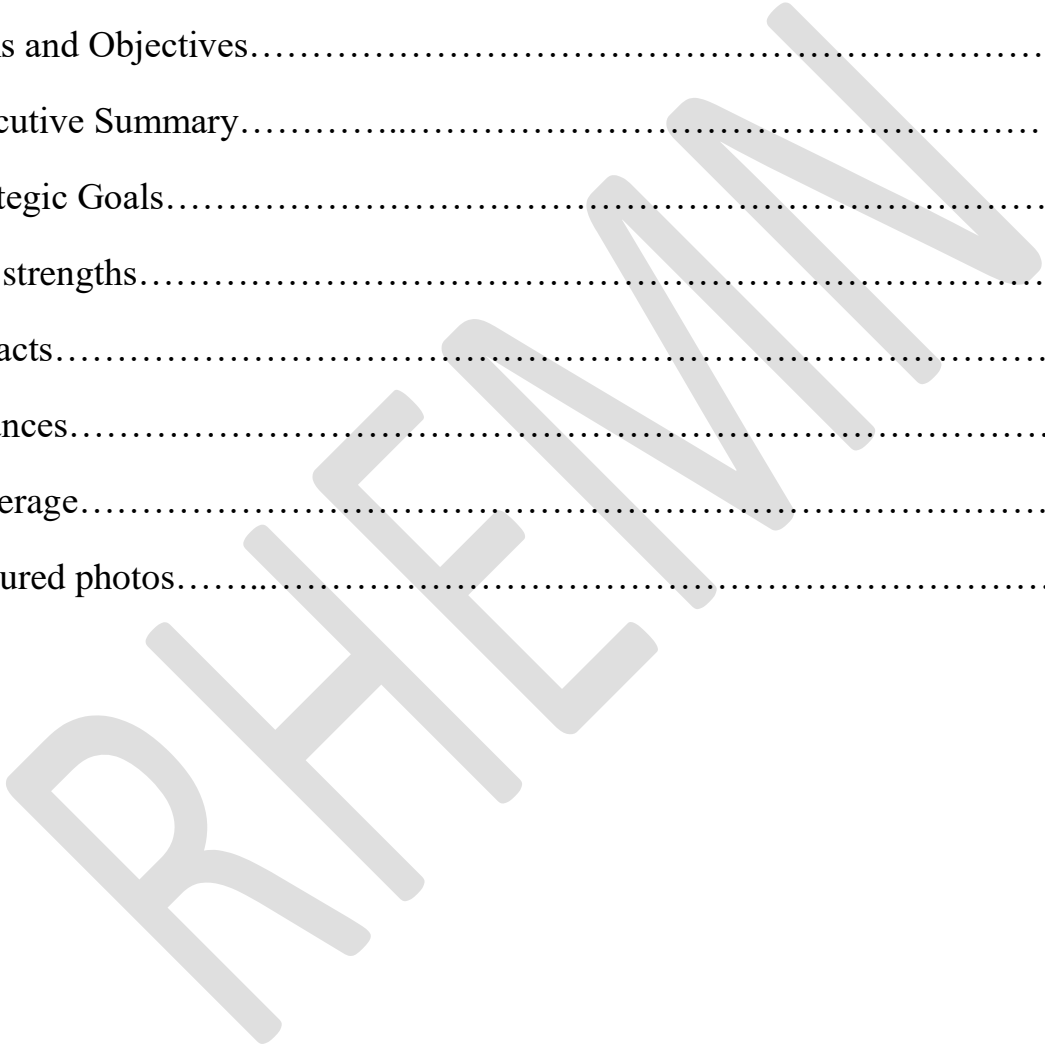
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NOTES FROM THE C.E.O

Dear friends,

This organization was founded in January 2014 for the purpose of providing access to basic health services to women and children living in hard-to-reach or neglected communities. About 70% of Nigerians live in rural areas and most of this population is women and children. This challenge needs a concerted effort by the government, communities, civil society organizations and individuals working together in all facets to provide solution.

The whole of 2014 was a structuring and planning year, our actual field activities started in June 2015 where we carried out the first project tagged “Free medical outreach” at Gembu in Mambilla plateau in Taraba State in partnership with Nigeria Muslim Forum UK. Here were able to reach about 2000 people including women, children and men in 2 days. We continued with this project in Deba community in Gombe State in partnership with Representative Abubakar Ahmad of Yamaltu/Deba constituency where we reached about 4000 people.

Having a huge financial constraint, 2016 had run out until November a new project was introduced tagged “Raise a healthy child”. It focuses on child health services and about 7 communities were targeted in Taraba and Gombe and the projects executed successfully.

We are looking forward to more sustainable innovative solutions for rural healthcare interventions in 2017. Our lead program now is “Raise a healthy child”. Our strong innovative potential is our biggest asset.

ABOUT US

RHEMN is a nonprofit and nongovernmental organization founded on established on 1st January 2014 for the purpose of providing sustainable access to essential healthcare services in hard-to-reach communities including underserved areas. The organization commenced services in 2015 and was legally registered with the Corporate Affairs commission of Nigeria on 17th March 2017

OUR MISSION

Our mission is to provide basic healthcare services to those living in rural or hard-to-reach communities including underserved areas. Our mission also covers social needs and humanitarian services during and after crisis or community conflicts.

OUR VISION

Our vision is to see every community in Nigeria with uninterrupted access to basic healthcare services and enjoy essential social needs and RHEMN leading the way to universal health coverage.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To provide access to basic healthcare service in rural, hard-to-reach and underserved communities to facilitate maximum healthcare coverage to eliminate disparities in healthcare, as well as healthcare access and quality and protect vulnerable individuals and communities from poor healthcare.
- To provide sustainable school health services in Nursery and primary schools to promote the safety, well-being, and healthy development of children and support young people's successful transition to adulthood;
- Ensure cost effective community-based affordable and easy access to sterile supplies especially during and after child birth and regular access to ante and essential supplement for women and children
- Promote economic and social well-being for individuals, families, and communities, including those with disabilities

- To train up required number of volunteers on Family Health Care, Traditional Birth attendants and health education programs etc.
- To co-operate and partner with the governmental Organizations and agencies seeking the goal of redressing mortality rate and improving health status of common people or relief and rehabilitation at the time of any disaster.
- To plan and execute Development, Relief and Rehabilitation programs within the terms of objects of the RHEMN.
- Provide comprehensive response to healthcare threads in rural areas whether natural or man-made
- Support wellness efforts across the life span, from protecting mental healthcare, to preventing risky behaviors such as tobacco use and substance abuse, to promote better nutrition and physical activity
- To seek and receive subscriptions, donations and other supports from persons, institutions or Organizations both from home and abroad and use the same for the purposes of the Organization.

THE EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report highlights our activities to provide access to basic healthcare in rural communities across Nigeria from January 2015 to December 2016. In 2015 our effort focuses on identifying hard-to reach communities and providing access to basic healthcare services using our mobile clinic approach via our famous program “Free medical outreach” for rural communities. We covered two communities in 2015 i.e Gembu in mambilla plateau and deba in Yamaltu-Deba. In both communities we have reached out to about 10560 beneficiaries. The main activities in this program include; health advocacy campaign to encourage early patronage to hospital, general consultation to treat minor ailments and refer complex cases, screening and treatment for malaria, distribution of insecticide treated nets to pregnant women, deworming and administration of vitamin A supplements to children below the age of five. The newest program tagged “Raise a healthy child” is a five year strategic project with three implementation phases design to provide sustainable approach to maternal and child care services in remote communities. The main activities of this program include deworming and administration of vitamin A supplement, screening and treatment of malaria, distribution of insecticide treated nets, distribution of prenatal supplement to rural women, health education, distribution of lifesaving sterile delivery kits for safe childbirth in rural communities, organizing training programs for community health workers and traditional birth attendants to acquire basic skills in newborn and community based infant and child feeding.

This project was launched in Gombe on 17 November 2016 in six communities including; Jauro Abbare (2071 beneficiaries), Kagarawal community (1808 beneficiaries), Nassarawo community (1866 beneficiaries), Gabukka community (1081 beneficiaries), Unguwa Uku (1579 beneficiaries) and Manawachi (1149 beneficiaries). The same project was also implemented in NTA ward in Jalingo where about 3078 people benefited.

We are determined on our priority strategic goals that focus on providing access to basic healthcare in underserved communities and ensuring healthy child growth, newborn care and safe motherhood.

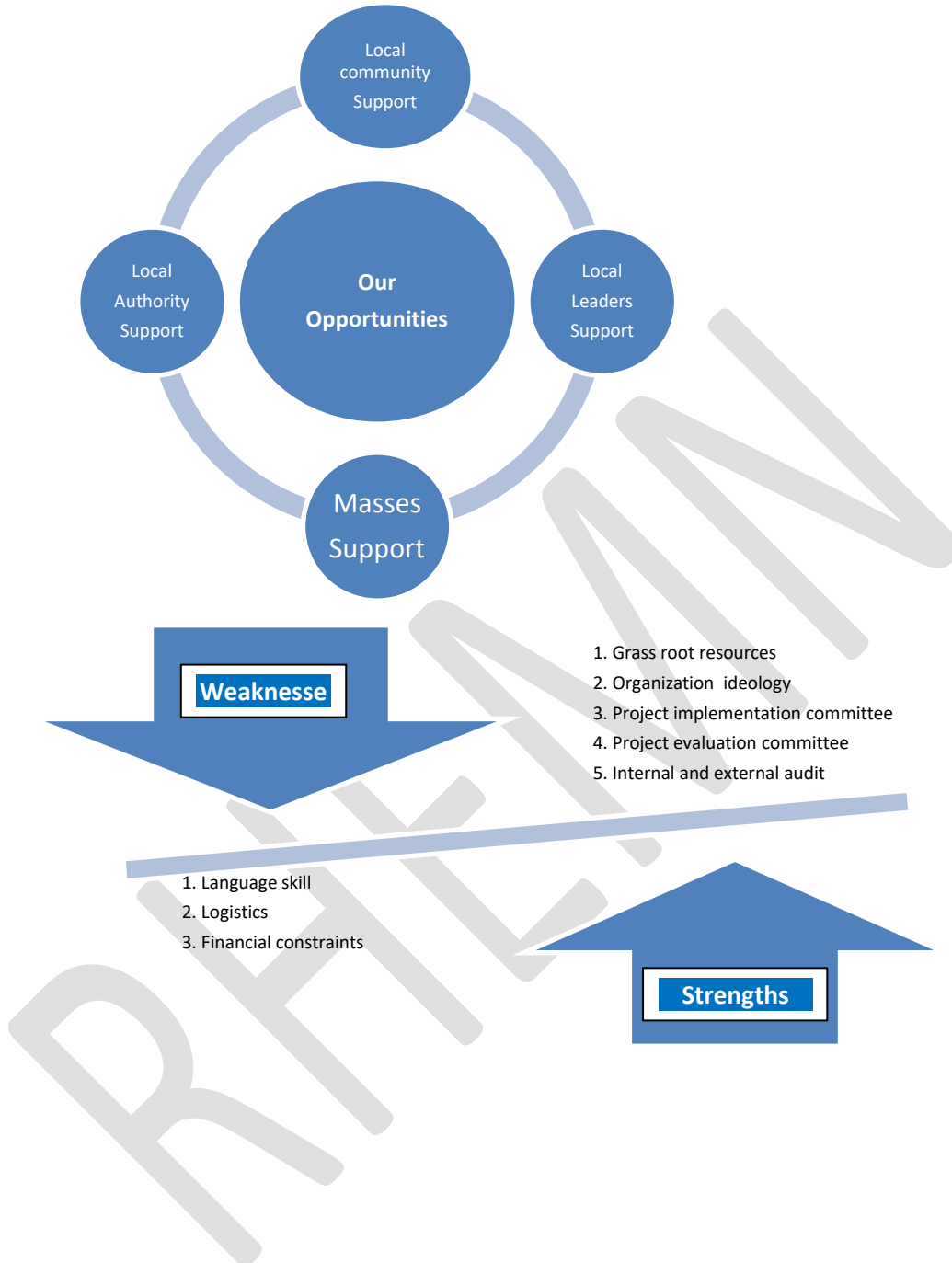
Strategic Goal one 1

Our goal 1 focus is to strengthen rural healthcare and improve access to basic healthcare services in hard-to-reach areas.

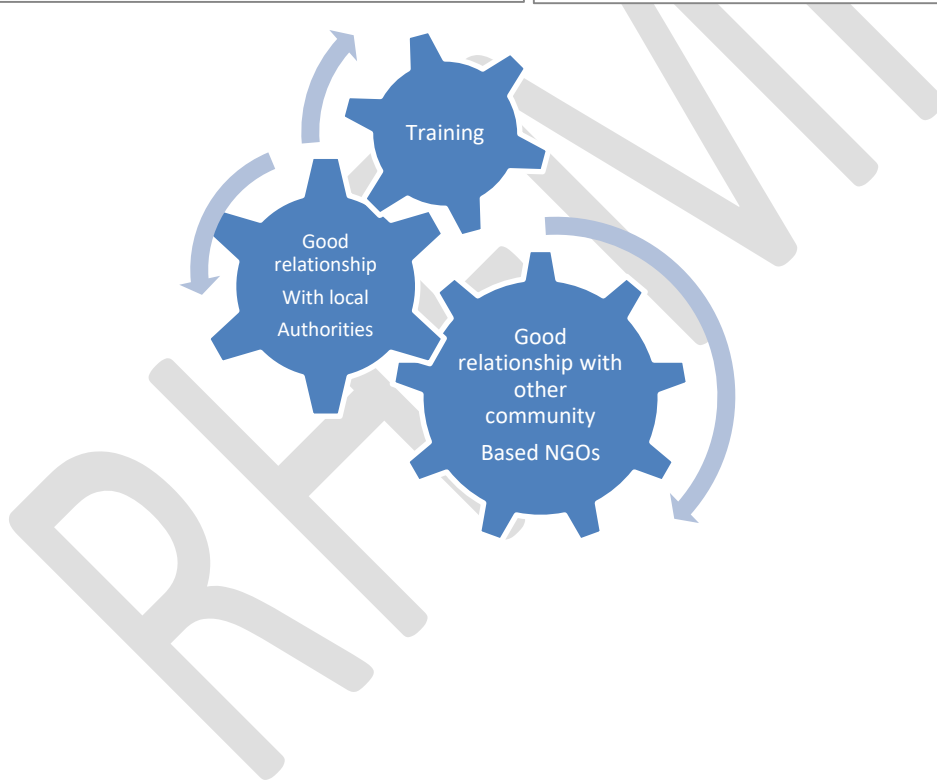
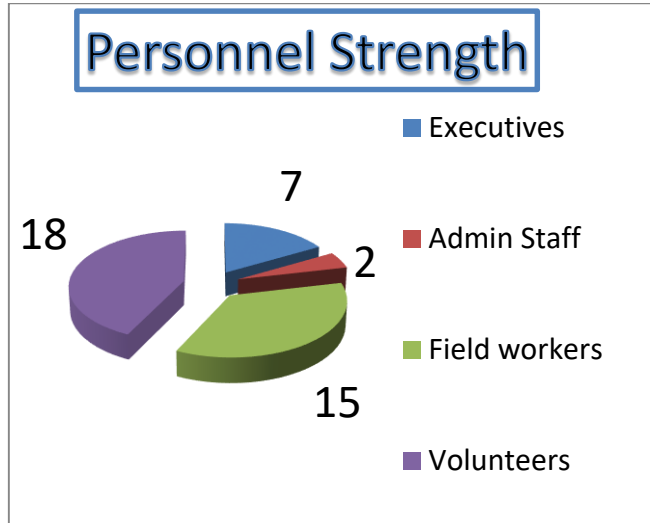
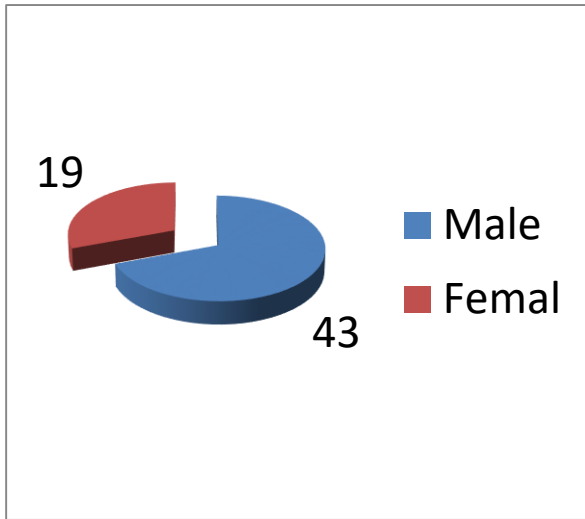

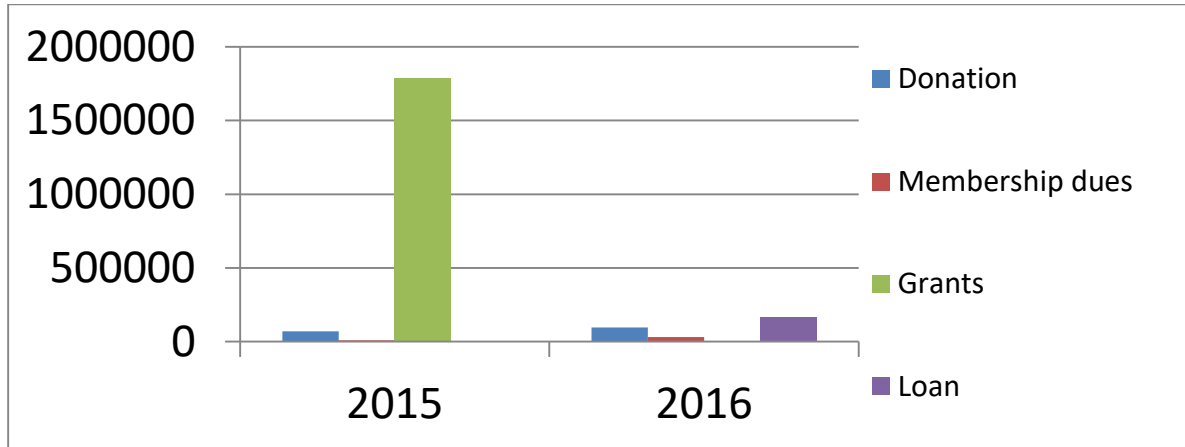

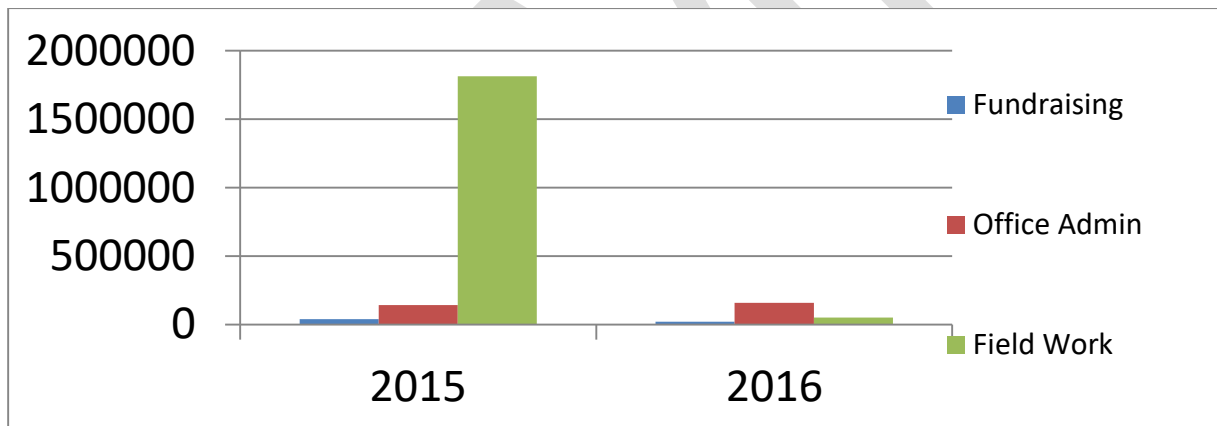

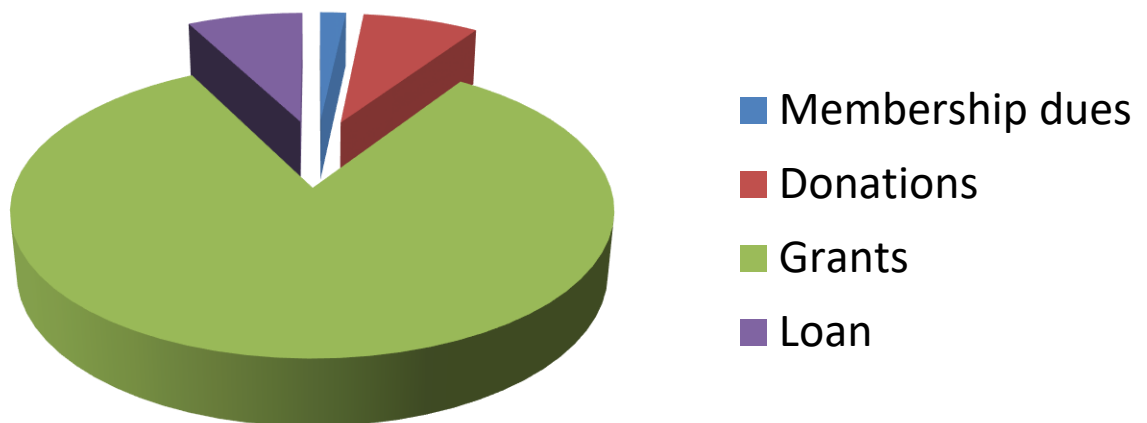
Income statement 1



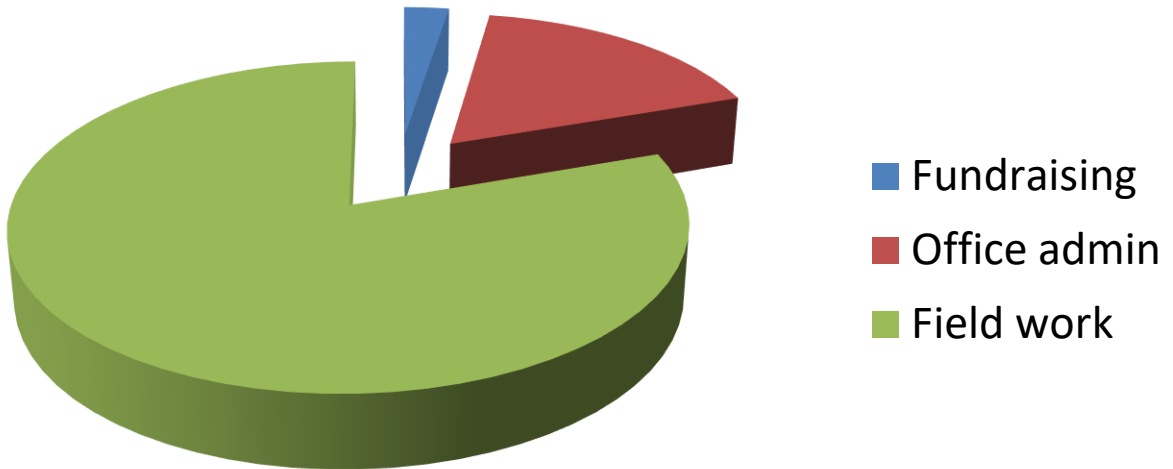
Expenses 1



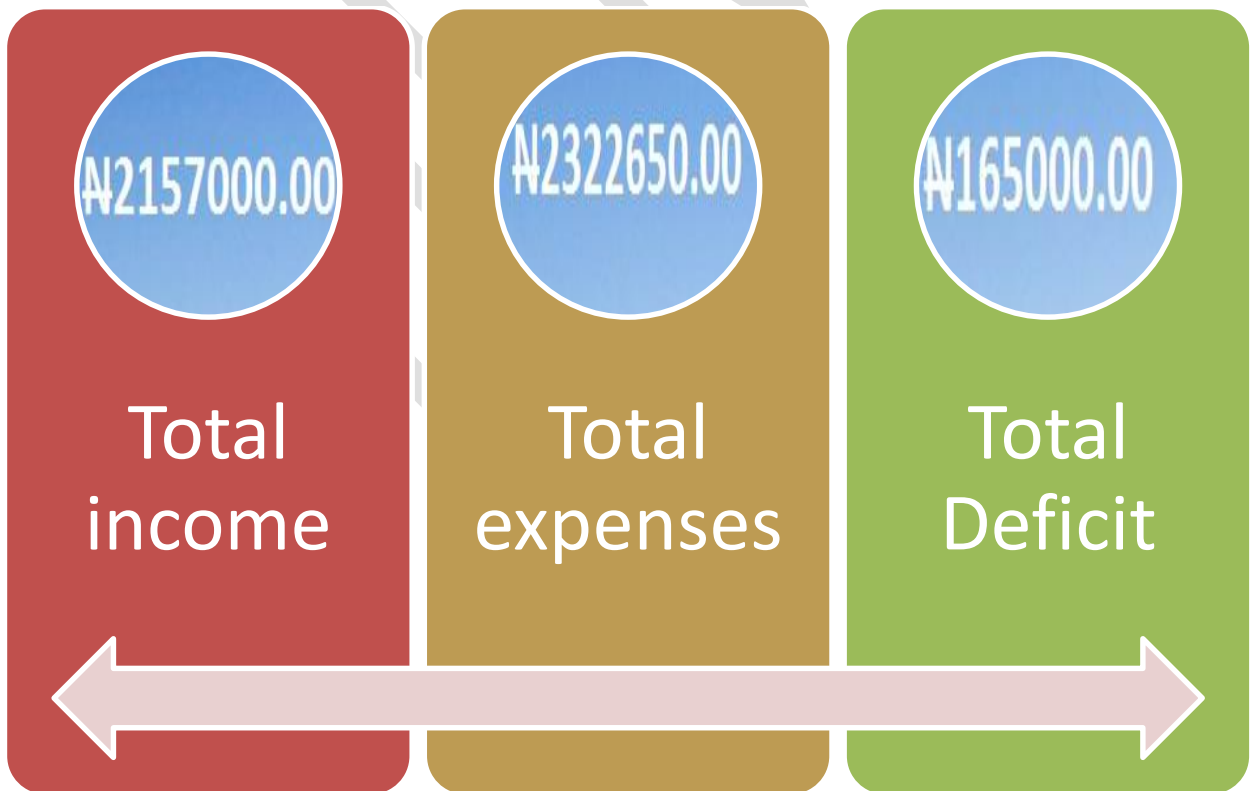
2015/2016 Income

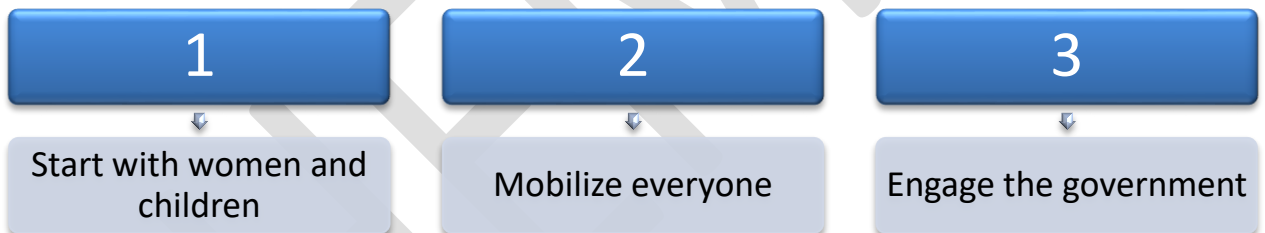
